## Fr. Yaw Acheampong: Joseph holds special place in Canada

Do you know that St. Joseph, the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is not only the patron saint of the universal Church but also the principal patron saint of Canada?

The history of the Church in Canada tells us that Fr. Joseph Le Caron, one of the first four missionaries to land in this country, chose St. Joseph as the patron saint of what was then New France on March 19, 1624. Almost 250 years later, in 1870, Pope Pius IX proclaimed St. Joseph the patron saint of the universal Church. And since 2013 his name has been included in all Eucharistic Prayers at Mass, emphasizing his importance in the life of the Church. So, each year on March 19, Canadians can take special pride as the Church celebrates the Solemnity of St. Joseph.

Who is St. Joseph to us, and why did the early missionaries decide to entrust the country to his spiritual care? St. Joseph is usually depicted in statues, stained glass windows and paintings carrying a flower, a lily — traditionally considered a symbol of purity. In Our Lady of Peace Church, there is a statue of Joseph carrying a lily in one hand and a tool in the other, symbolizing his work as a carpenter. ## Catechism Corner

#### How should a family live its faith together?

A Christian family should be a miniature church. All Christian family members are invited to strengthen one another in faith and to outdo one another in their zeal for God. They should pray for and with each other and collaborate in works of charity. Parents stand in for their children with their own faith, have them baptized, and serve as their models of faith. That means that parents should make it possible for their children to experience how valuable and beneficial it is to live in the familiar presence of the loving God. At some time, however, the parents, too, will learn from their children's faith and hear how God speaks through them, because the faith of young people is often accompanied by greater devotion and generosity and "because the Lord often reveals to a younger person what is better" (St. Benedict of Nursia, Rule, chap. 3, 3). For example, the annual operating expenditure budget of St. Philip Parish is approximately \$155,000, which goes towards paying for the following items:


- Paying for the parish priest, the parish office administrator, replacement priests to say Mass and the parish bookkeeper;
- Diocesan tax on parish revenues (donations);
- Utilities (heat, hydro, water, sewer, utilities, etc.)
- Repairs and maintenance on St. Philip Church, the Parish Hall, and other buildings and grounds;
- Office expenses: and.
- Pastoral expenses.

In addition, St. Philip Parish also spends about \$10,000-\$20,000 per year on major projects and renovations to replace and/or renovate the parish buildings and other items within the parish.

**CEMETERY REMINDER: NO PLANTING OR ORNAMENTS IN THE CEMETERY** 

With Spring upon us, we would like to remind people about cemetery by-laws 14 a) b) and c):

\*\*\*\*\*

No ornamentation or decoration is permitted, other than flowers or wreaths affixed to the top of a monument /marker; specifically, flower gardens planted on the grave or at the base of the monuments are not permitted as they interfere with grass cutting and trimming, and with the proper care and maintenance of cemetery grounds.

No glass or loose articles, such as containers, solar lights and wreath holders, etc., or border fencing and stone borders, shall be used or left on any lot as they can be dangerous to persons performing routine maintenance.

No trees or shrubs are permitted - if any existing trees or shrubs have become, by means of their roots, branches or in any other way, detrimental to the adjacent lots, or prejudicial to the general appearance of the grounds, the Board may remove such trees, shrubs or parts thereof without prior
