Fr Bob writes:

During the Exodus from Egypt, the people of Israel complained about the food. So God led them into an area infested with a type of venomous snake whose bite caused a severe burning sensation and even death for some. The people realized that there were worse things than bad food and asked God's forgiveness for their complaining. God told Moses to "make a seraph and mount it on a pole. If anyone, who has been bitten, looks at it, he will recover" (Numbers 21:8). The instrument of suffering was converted into the sign of healing grace.

The image of Jesus suffering on the cross is converted into the ultimate sign of healing grace. The cross was the instrument, but it is looking to Jesus that brings us the healing saving grace of God. That is why we Catholics generally prefer the crucifix with the image of Jesus on it.

As someone once said "At the cross, man's biggest "NO" to God becomes God's biggest "YES" to man!"



How is your Lent going?

We sometimes think of this season as a miserable one, full of fasting and inconvenience. After all, one of the most famous Lenten images is a barren desert.

But Lent isn't meant to be a time of exile or dryness. Rather, it's an opportunity for us to flee from the distractions of regular life into Jesus' arms. When we are with him, we know we will find refreshment. The Lord has an oasis waiting in this Lenten desert for you. He wants to grow closer to you and bring new freshness to your faith. He can strengthen you in areas you are struggling. All he asks for is your 'yes' to trust in him and follow where he leads.



Catechism Corner

What is regulated by the Seventh Commandment: "You shall not steal" (Ex 20:15)?

The Seventh Commandment not only forbids taking something away from another person, it also requires the just management and distribution of the earth's goods; it regulates the question of private property and the distribution of the proceeds from human work. The unjust distribution of raw materials is also indicted in this commandment. In the first place, the Seventh Commandment actually forbids only taking someone else's property unlawfully. However, it also addresses the human endeavor to make just social arrangements in the world and to plan for its beneficial development. The Seventh Commandment says that we are obliged in faith to advocate the protection of the environment as part of creation and to conserve the earth's natural resources. (YOUCAT questions 426-427)

Why is it important to support the parishes financially? Just like any other charity or non-profit organization, it costs money to keep St. Philip Parish and St. Clare Mission afloat. For example, the annual operating expenditure budget of St. Philip Parish is approximately \$155,000, which goes towards paying for the following items:

- Paying for the parish priest, the parish office administrator, replacement priests to say Mass and the parish bookkeeper;
- Diocesan tax on parish revenues (donations);
- Utilities (heat, hydro, water, sewer, utilities, etc.)
- Repairs and maintenance on St. Philip Church, the Parish Hall, and other buildings and grounds;
- Office expenses; and,
- Pastoral expenses.


