Fr Bob Writes:

"How was Jesus' resurrected body different from that same body prior to the resurrection?" In paragraph 646, the "Catechism of the Catholic Church' teaches that "Christ's resurrection was not a return to earthly life," as was the case with the daughter of Jairus, the widow's son, and Lazarus, who would all die again. "In his risen body, he (Christ) passes from the state of death to another life beyond time and space.". Paul's letter to the Philippians (2:6-7) tells us that the Son of God "emptied himself" of the divine attributes (all-knowing, unlimited in space and time, etc) while retaining the divine nature, taking on our human nature with its

limited attributes. In the resurrection, the divine attributes, which the Son had voluntarily set aside, were returned in a "glorified body."

During those days following his resurrection, Jesus "weaned" the apostles of their dependence on him being physically present. He appeared to them only for brief visits. On at least three instances, he had a different appearance and voice than what they were used to. With the Ascension and coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the disciples would come to understand that Jesus was still present with them but in a less limited way in which they had known his presence before.

Catechism Corner

What is meant by commutative justice? Commutative justice regulates exchanges between persons in accordance with a strict respect for their rights. It makes sure that property rights are safeguarded, debts repaid, and freely contracted obligations are fulfilled, that reparation is made for injustice or damage, and that stolen goods are returned.

Is it permissible to use tax dodges? Inventiveness in dealing with complex systems of taxation is morally unobjectionable. It is immoral to evade taxes or to commit tax fraud, in other words, to falsify, fail to report, or conceal facts so as to prevent a correct assessment of taxes due. By paying taxes, citizens contribute, each according to his ability, so that the State can fulfill its duties. Therefore tax evasion is not a petty infraction. Taxes should be just and proportionate and should be levied by law. (YOUCAT questions 430-431)


- Paying for the parish priest, the parish office administrator, replacement priests to say Mass and the parish bookkeeper;

- Utilities (heat, hydro, water, sewer, utilities, etc.)
- Repairs and maintenance on St. Philip Church, the Parish Hall, and other buildings and grounds;
- Office expenses: and.
- Pastoral expenses.

In addition, St. Philip Parish also spends about \$10,000-\$20,000 per year on major projects and renovations to replace and/or renovate the parish buildings and other items within the parish.
