Fr Bob Writes:

Our gospel this weekend focuses on the theme of "Jesus the Good Shepherd," to relate to this Sunday being the 'World Day of Prayer for Vocations.' Whether or not they had anything to do with sheep, Jewish people identified with the shepherd image in which their tradition was so deeply grounded. Abraham, Isaac and Jacob were shepherds. Moses became a shepherd when he fled from Egypt to Midian. David was a shepherd at the time he was anointed the future king by Samuel. Matthew speaks of God's appointed ruler who will "shepherd my people Israel" (2:6), the people needing direction for their lives "like sheep without a shepherd" (9:36) and the division of people at the end of time "as a shepherd separates sheep from goats" (25:32). The parable of the shepherd seeking out the lost sheep is found in all three synoptic gospels. John 10 reiterates a number of times that Jesus is the "Good Shepherd."

Who are the "sheep that do not belong to this fold" that Jesus mentions in our gospel this weekend? This is generally believed to refer to the Gentiles or pagans, people of non-Jewish race and religious background who will hear Jesus' voice through the proclamation of the gospel.

The last verses of this text indicate Jesus' awareness and acceptance of his call. Although deeply anxious about his impending death, indicated by the blood in his sweat during prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus chose to complete his mission in this world. His sacrificial death was not forced upon him against his will. Sometimes we are blessed to know that certain challenges placed before us in this life are part of God's plan which will result in good for others and eternal blessings for ourselves. Will we have the strength to say "yes" to God in such moments?

Catechism Corner

May a Christian speculate in the stock market or in Internet stocks? A Christian can speculate in the stock market or in Internet stocks, as long as he does so within the parameters of normal business practices for prudently investing one's own or someone else's money and does not thereby break any other commandments. Speculating in stocks becomes immoral when dishonest means are used (for instance, insider information); when the transaction puts one's own or another's life savings at risk instead of insuring an income; when such speculation becomes an addiction, as with games of chance.

How should we treat property that belongs to everyone? Vandalism and deliberately damaging public facilities and common property are forms of theft, and restitution must be made.

May a Christian make bets and play games of chance? Betting and gambling are immoral and dangerous when the gambler risks his livelihood. It becomes even worse if he risks the livelihood of other people, especially of those who are entrusted to his care. Morally speaking, it is a highly dubious practice to wager large sums on a game of chance while others lack the bare necessities of life. Betting and gambling, furthermore, can be addictive and enslave people. (YOUCAT questions 432-434)

Why is it important to support the parishes financially? Just like any other charity or non-profit organization, it costs money to keep St. Philip Parish and St. Clare Mission afloat. For example, the annual operating expenditure budget of St. Philip Parish is approximately \$155,000, which goes towards paying for the following items:

- Paying for the parish priest, the parish office administrator, replacement priests to say Mass and the parish bookkeeper;
- Diocesan tax on parish revenues (donations);
- Utilities (heat, hydro, water, sewer, utilities, etc.)
- Repairs and maintenance on St. Philip Church, the Parish Hall, and other buildings and grounds;
- Office expenses; and,
- Pastoral expenses.




