Fr Bob Writes:

The first letter of John, which forms the second reading during these weeks of the Easter season, puts great emphasis on putting our words into practice, "love not in word and speech but in deed and truth." The word for love here is "agape," the God-like love rooted not in emotion but in the will. The Greek word for "heart" is "Kardia' (see our word "cardiac." The Latin is "cor" from which the English word "core" is derived. The figurative use of the word heart was more encompassing in the Bible times than in modern language. Heart was more than that organ pumping blood. It meant the "core" of one's physical being, intellect, and will. While you and I may desire in our heart to follow

God's will perfectly, there is something at the very core of our being that keeps us doing that... something which, if it were to be the key spokesman for our conscience, would condemn us.

"Who will condemn us?" Paul asks in Romans 8:34, if Jesus is the one who intercedes for us and God is the one who acquits us. Here John touches on that same theme. Where our hearts might condemn us, God is greater than our heart. This is not a statement of presumption or satisfaction with imperfection but of encouragement not to let our sins weigh us down, to do our best to put our faith into practice.

Catechism Corner

Is it permissible to "buy" and "sell" human beings?

No human being, not even parts of a human being, may be turned into commodities, nor may a person make himself a commodity. Man belongs to God and has been endowed by him with freedom and dignity. Buying and selling people, as is common practice nowadays, and not only in prostitution, is a profoundly reprehensible act. Trafficking in organs for transplantation and in embryos for the biotech industry or in children for purposes of adoption, the recruiting of child soldiers, prostitution the age-old injustice of trafficking in human beings and slavery is reappearing everywhere. People are deprived of their freedom, their dignity, and their right of selfdetermination, even of their lives. Others reduce them to objects with which their owner can make a profit. Human trafficking in the strict sense should be distinguished from dealings between sports teams. Here, too, there is talk about "buying" and "selling" players, but of course these are transactions that presuppose the athletes' free consent. For example, the annual operating expenditure budget of St. Philip Parish is approximately \$155,000, which goes towards paying for the following items:


- Paying for the parish priest, the parish office administrator, replacement priests to say Mass and the parish bookkeeper;
- Diocesan tax on parish revenues (donations);
- Utilities (heat, hydro, water, sewer, utilities, etc.)
- Repairs and maintenance on St. Philip Church, the Parish Hall, and other buildings and grounds;
- Office expenses: and.
- Pastoral expenses.

In addition, St. Philip Parish also spends about \$10,000-\$20,000 per year on major projects and renovations to replace and/or renovate the parish buildings and other items within the parish.
