


Fr Bob Writes:

ST. PHILIP PARISH

Say what we will, the greater part of our working hours goes into providing for ourselves and for others. In addition, we grow up with our attention riveted on succeeding. First of all, we want to make sure that we have enough for ourselves and our children. But then the strong consumerism of our society forces our standard of living to an ever higher level. It is all too easy to become entangled in the things that are "passing away," Like the rich man in Jesus' parable in today's gospel, we build bigger and better barns. We don't really avert to the possibility of its ending suddenly and earlier rather than later.

Today's scriptures are not a prediction of an early death. Nor does Ecclesiastes tell us to stop working. It is basically a reminder to keep perspective. We cannot risk to lose ourselves in the transient and forget or neglect that "which is above". It also tells us to use wealth generously while we are alive rather than have people fight over it after we are gone. Without calling for a rigorous poverty there is no doubting the fact that a simplicity of life keeps our vision clear. It doesn't hurt to be rather spartan. It keeps us in shape for the marathon in life that really counts. In addition, St Paul, in our second reading, reminds us that immersion in the things of this world can easily tempt us to greed and immorality. And that means we run the danger of losing everything. With our Christian values in place, we have the wealth that really counts. And when the day comes to move on, we shall have done well but not lost our freedom - or our real inheritance.

Pope's Intentions for August 2025

For mutual coexistence

Let us pray that societies where coexistence seems more difficult might not succumb to the temptation of confrontation for ethnic, political, religious, or ideological reasons.

Catechism Corner

Are there various ways to pray? Yes, there is vocal prayer, meditation, and contemplative prayer. All three ways of prayer presuppose recollecting one's mind and heart.

What is vocal prayer? In the first place, prayer is lifting the heart to God. And yet Jesus himself taught his disciples to pray with words. With the Our Father he left us the perfect vocal prayer as his testament to show how we should pray. While praying we should not try to think pious thoughts. We should express what is in our hearts and offer it to God as complaint, petition, praise, and thanks. Often it is the great vocal prayers - the Psalms and hymns of Sacred Scripture, the Our Father, the Hail Mary that direct us to the true substance of prayer and lead to a kind of free, interior prayer.

What is the essence of meditation? The essence of meditation is a prayerful seeking that starts with a sacred text or a sacred image and explores the will, the signs, and the presence of God. We cannot "read" sacred images and texts the way we read things in the newspaper that do not immediately concern us. Instead, we should meditate on them; in other words I should lift my heart to God and tell him that I am now quite open to what God wants to say to me through what I have read or seen. Besides Sacred Scripture, there are many texts that lead to God and are suitable for meditative prayer. (YOUCAT questions 500-502). Dig Deeper: CCC section (2699-2708) and other references here.

Why is it important to support the parishes financially? Just like any other charity or non-profit organization, it costs money to keep St. Philip Parish and St. Clare Mission afloat. For example, the annual operating expenditure budget of St. Philip Parish is approximately \$155,000, which goes towards paying for the following items:

- Paying for the parish priest, the parish office administrator, replacement priests to say Mass and the parish bookkeeper;
- Diocesan tax on parish revenues (donations);
- Utilities (heat, hydro, water, sewer, utilities, etc.)
- Repairs and maintenance on St. Philip Church, the Parish Hall, and other buildings and grounds;
- Office expenses; and,
- Pastoral expenses.

In addition, St. Philip Parish also spends about \$10,000-\$20,000 per year on major projects and renovations to replace and/or renovate the parish buildings and other items
