Fr Bob Writes:

In explaining the background to the birth of Jesus, Matthew tells us in our gospel today that Mary was "engaged" to Joseph. The better word is "betrothed." A year-long betrothal was the first part of an official marriage for Jewish couples. Formal betrothal had legal effects. Although not living together, for all practical purposes the couple were considered married. The fiancé would already be considered to be "husband" and could release himself from the "betrothal" only by an act of repudiation, which Joseph is considering as our gospel today opens. Infidelity during this time was considered adultery. In the male-dominated Jewish society, a woman pregnant by another man could be publicly condemned, sent back to her parents to remain unmarried for the rest of her life, or even put to death. No similar penalty fell to the man involved. Joseph waived his rights to such actions in taking Mary as his wife. That Joseph formally accepts Mary and her child gives Jesus legal paternity and his Davidic lineage, and therefore fulfils a crucial criterion for Messiahship.

The theme of Emmanuel, "*God is with us*," is central to today's narrative. Jesus is declared to be both Son of God and Son of Mary. This is effected through the virginal conception of Jesus by the power of God. Matthew here explicitly carries the sonship of Jesus back from his resurrection and his baptism to the time of his conception. By using the Greek version of the Old Testament instead of the Hebrew one, Matthew is able to substitute the Greek word "*Parthenos*," i.e. "virgin" for the Hebrew "*almah*", i.e. "young woman" in Isaiah 7:14, and thus show how Jesus' conception from the Virgin Mary was prophesied by the prophet Isaiah centuries before the event itself

A greater awareness of what the writer intended in his message enables the bible to be what God intends it to be for us today...God's living word to bring us to faith and strengthen that same faith.

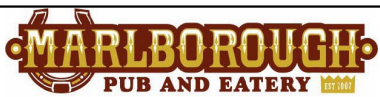

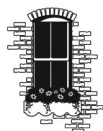

+Behold, I come to do your will, O God ... Hebrews 10:7

Have you ever stopped to think that God wants you to be happy? It is god's will that your joy may be complete. Jesus told us this the night before he died. So when you say, 'I have come to do your will, O God,' you are agreeing to being happy.

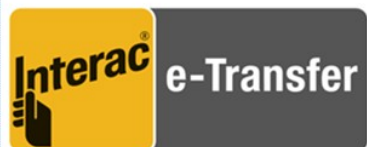
That means you must "give yourself permission to be happy." Some actually say that because of past sins they do not have a right to be happy. Nonsense! The good news is that your sins are forgiven.

Jesus died that you might live. Look up and smell the roses. Jesus invites you to look at nature. "Look at the birds of the sky; they do not show or read, they gather nothing into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not more important than they?" (Matthew 6:26).

People torture themselves with fear. They worry over whether their life has any meaning. Ralph Waldo Emerson wrote a beautiful passage to answer that fear: "Whether by a healthy child, a garden patch, or a redeemed social condition, to know that even one life has breathed easier because you lived: This is to have succeeded."

Why is it important to support the parishes financially?

Just like any other charity or non-profit organization, it costs money to keep St. Philip Parish and St. Clare Mission afloat. For example, the annual operating expenditure budget of St. Philip Parish is approximately \$155,000, which goes towards paying for the following items:

- Paying for the parish priest, the parish office administrator, replacement priests to say Mass and the parish bookkeeper;
- Diocesan tax on parish revenues (donations);
- Utilities (heat, hydro, water, sewer, utilities, etc.)
- Repairs and maintenance on St. Philip Church, the Parish Hall, and other buildings and grounds;
- Office expenses; and,
- Pastoral expenses.

In addition, St. Philip Parish also spends about \$10,000-\$20,000 per year on major projects and renovations to replace and/or renovate the parish buildings and other items within the parish.
